- 3_Debussy.mp3
- 4_Giroux.mp3
- 5_Dvorak.mp3
- 6_Sousa.mp3

2. Upload files to a single folder in a cloud provider of your choice (Google Drive, Dropbox, etc.). Create a PUBLICLY VIEWABLE link to the folder and add the link to the body of an email. Do not send videos or include any identifying information in the recordings or links.

3. Attach a recent résumé in PDF format with your current physical address, phone, and email address to the email with the link to your recording folder – send to: usarmyfieldbandauditions@army.mil.

*Preliminary round recordings and résumés are due November 2, 2025.



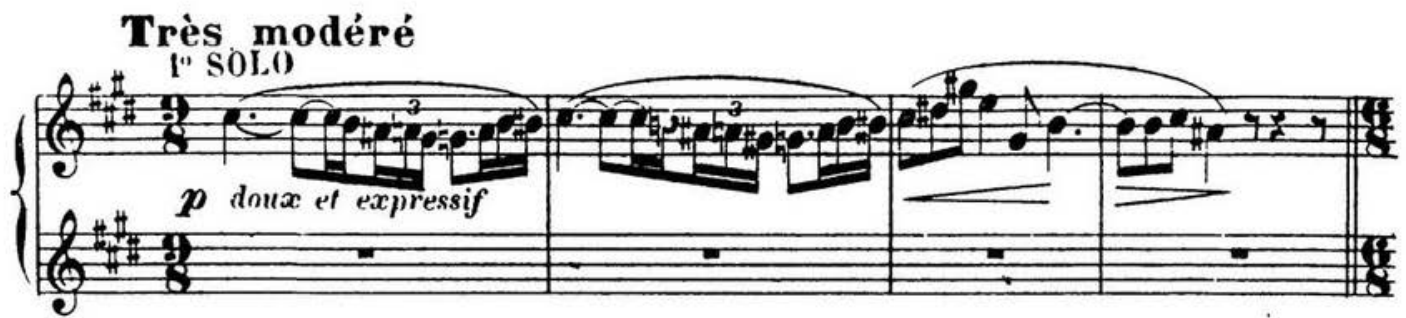


